CITY OF TEKAMAH

PROPOSITION 1

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Shall the City of Tekamah establish an economic development program as described here by appropriating annually one-half percent (0.5%) of a local option sales and use tax, estimated to generate approximately \$87,000 per year, for 10 years, for an estimated total of \$870,000?

A vote YES will result in implementing the Economic Development Program. A vote NO will result in not implementing the Economic Development Program.

Summary of Economic Development Program:

i. Description of the Economic Development Program: The goals of the Program are to generate additional employment opportunities; retain and grow the local tax base; recruit new businesses; recruit and retain residents; retain and expand existing businesses; revitalize Tekamah's downtown area and central business district; and aid housing development. These goals will be achieved, in part, by establishing a grant and loan fund for use by qualified businesses and grant funding for public works improvements essential to qualifying businesses. The Program will be implemented and monitored in accordance with Nebraska's Local Option Municipal Economic Development Act.

ii. Duration of the Program: The length of the Program shall be a period of ten (10) years, from June 2018 through May 2028.

iii. Years for Collection of Funds: Collection of funds for the Program shall be on all taxable sales beginning June 2018 or as soon thereafter as provided by Nebraska Department of Revenue regulations, and ending May 2028, provided, however, if bonds are issued and the local option sales and use tax revenue is pledged for payment of such bonds, the collection of funds shall terminate on the first day of the calendar quarter after payment of such bonds and refunding bonds.

iv. Source of Funds: The source of funds for the Program shall be one-half percent (0.5%) of a sales and use tax imposed pursuant to the Local Option Revenue Act, Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 77-27,142 through 77-27,148, as amended. Additional funds from other non-City sources will not be sought beyond those derived from local sources of revenue.

v. Issuance of Bonds: The Program includes a provision that proposes the City issue bonds pursuant to Nebraska's Local Option Municipal Economic Development Act to provide funds to carry out the Program.

vi. Total Amounts to be Collected from Local Sources of Revenue: The total amount to be collected from local sources of revenue is estimated to be \$87,000 each year for a period of ten (10) years, for an estimated total of \$870,000.

**CITY OF TEKAMAH
PROPOSITION 2
LOCAL OPTION SALES AND USE TAX INCREASE**

Shall the governing body of the City of Tekamah, for a period of 10 years, increase Tekamah's local option sales and use tax by the amount of one-half percent (0.5%) upon the same transactions within the City on which the State of Nebraska is authorized to impose a tax, with the proceeds of such tax being allocated to fund the Tekamah Economic Development Program?

A vote YES will result in the increase of Tekamah's local option sales and use tax by the amount of one-half percent (0.5%) (from 1.5% to 2.0%), with the additional 0.5% to be used to implement and fund the Tekamah Economic Development Program. A vote NO will not result in an increase of Tekamah's local option sales and use tax by one-half percent (0.5%) (from 1.5% to 2.0%) to fund the Tekamah Economic Development Program, and will also result in the Tekamah Economic Development Program not being implemented.

Summary of Local Option Tax:

- i. Reduction or Elimination of Other Taxes or Fees: The one-half percent (0.5%) local option sales and use tax will not reduce or eliminate other taxes or fees.
- ii. Projects to be Funded: The revenue collected will be used to fund the Tekamah Economic Development Program.
- iii. Duration of Tax: The tax will be effective for a period of ten (10) years, beginning June 2018 or as soon thereafter as provided by Nebraska Department of Revenue regulations, and ending May 2028, provided, however, if bonds are issued pursuant to the Tekamah Economic Development Program and some or all of the local option revenue is pledged for payment of such bonds, the tax will be collected until the first day of the calendar quarter after the payment in full of such bonds and any refunding bonds.
- iv. Percentage of Revenue for Interlocal Purposes. No percentage of revenue collected will be used for the purposes of an interlocal agreement or joint public agency agreement.
