The Burt County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Monday, December 28, 2020 in the Courtroom of the Burt County Courthouse in Tekamah, Nebraska, pursuant to adjournment of their last meeting. The meeting was also available via ZOOM meeting (virtual) session. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by Publication in the Oakland Independent (12-24-2020), upon a 1<sup>st</sup> floor bulletin board within the courthouse and on the County’s Website. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the office of the County Clerk. The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance at 9:00 A.M. Chairman Schold informed the public that the Open Meeting Act was available to the public on the courtroom railing.

*ROADS discussions with Highway Superintendent, Ann Chytka:*

*Striping:* Chytka read a letter of concern about striping on County Road L. Chytka recommended full striping be done on various county roads in Spring 2021; it is too cold at this point in the year.

Connealy moved the Board recess at 10:01 AM for *Board of Equalization*, Morrow



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seconded, motion passed with All Ayes. The Burt County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 10:04 AM upon motion by Richards, seconded by Connealy, with All Ayes.

Emergency Manager Updates from Andrew Donawa:

equipment – Donawa informed the Board of three (3) system needs recommended from the State of Nebraska: (1) AlertSense is a public notification system, annual cost \$3,500.00; (2) an emergency reporting system that is used for incident documentation, annual cost \$1,000.00; (3) CAD system, annual cost \$2,007.50. The systems are all web-based, so there will be no need for additional equipment. No action was taken on the systems.

office info – Donawa introduced the “NE Emergency Management Act” document to the Board. He explained that they could find information about duties, necessary tools/equipment, etc. in the document if any ever there were unanswered questions/concerns with what is needed and/or done by a County Emergency Manager. Donawa also made mention of the need to take his EM vehicle home; this policy will be discussed at a future meeting, action could not be taken today due to this not being on today’s agenda.

Donawa asked the board to appoint two (2) board members to sit on the Burt County Incident Management Team (IMT); the board will appoint these (2) members at their January re-organizational meeting.

updates (2) – (1) The Public Health Department (ELVPH) informed Donawa that he should only be getting PPE to supply the County’s Emergency Services; any PPE needed for the Courthouse shall be purchased by the County, not obtained from a Health Dept. (2) Donawa read the Press Release from a Natural Gas Pipeline explosion that happened on 12-24-2020 in rural Burt County between the Cities of Oakland and Lyons.

Mark VanDerHart, Chairman of Tekamah Airport Joint Zoning Board gave a presentation to the Board to provide information about the Airport’s Zoning Jurisdiction/Regulations. He explained that the airport’s zoning does take precedence over any local zoning regulations that are put into place by Political Subdivisions.

PUBLIC HEARING for County Zoning Regulation updates: Chairman Schold stated that the purpose of the Public Hearing is to give the public the opportunity to speak about the presented changes to the Burt County Zoning Regulations; there was a three (3) minute time limit set. Chairman Schold stated that the public hearing is being held with a ‘virtual’ option via Zoom due to COVID prohibiting gatherings. Chairman Schold explained that comments will be asked for different categories of proposed changes: Glossary, Livestock Setbacks, Airport Zoning, Solar, Wind. Chairman Schold opened the public hearing at 10:30 a.m.

GLOSSARY – no public comments

LIVESTOCK SET BACKS –

1) Edison McDonald, Director of Development and Government Relations for GC Resolve, 909 W. 10<sup>th</sup> ST., Hickman, NE spoke via zoom - opposed decreasing set- backs, he expressed concerns of large livestock operations being too close to others’ homes/properties.

2) Victor Jensen, 3030 Co.Rd. P, Tekamah, NE spoke via zoom – opposed minimizing set-



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backs, he is in favor of reciprocal set-backs.

AIRPORT ZONING – no public comments

SOLAR -

- 1) Sean Connealy, 2725 Old Hwy 118, Decatur, NE spoke in person -opposed
- 2) Michaela Valentin, Government & Community Relations Manager Public Affairs for OPPD, 444 S. 16<sup>th</sup> Street Mall, Omaha, NE spoke via zoom -submitted OPPD comments on the regulations, spoke in favor of solar regulations.
- 3) Graham Christensen, President of GC ReVOLT, 1740 Co.Rd. P, Lyons, NE spoke via zoom – stated he is neutral on solar regulations as presented but offered comments in favor of fees based on project size.
- 4) Victor Jensen, 3030 Co.Rd. P, Tekamah, NE spoke via zoom – in favor of solar, but opposed high permit fees.
- 5) Michael Knapp on behalf of Sandhills Energy, 1209 Harney St., Omaha, NE spoke via zoom – in favor of solar regulations.
- 6) Michael Degan, attorney on behalf of Invenergy, 9500 W. Dodge Rd., Ste.100, Omaha, NE spoke via zoom – neutral, feels regulations are a positive step but asked the County show leeway with height limitations.

WIND-

- 1) Robert Byrnes, 300 Main St, Lyons, NE spoke in person – opposed; concerns of large turbine setbacks
- 2) Jill Spenner, 1105 Co.Rd. 45, Tekamah, NE spoke in person – opposed; expressed concerns of large turbines and decommissioning
- 3) Sean Connealy, 2725 Old Hwy 118, Decatur, NE spoke in person -opposed
- 4) Eric Devaney, 915 O Street, Tekamah, NE; building in rural Burt County at Co.Rd. 32 & Co.Rd. P spoke in person – opposed to commercial sized wind farms
- 5) David Bracht, Attorney representing land owners of Burt County Wind, 1650 Farnam St, Omaha, NE spoke via zoom – in favor of wind/renewable energy and landowner rights, opposed to high fees and heavy regulations.
- 6) Graham Christensen, President of GC ReVOLT, 1740 Co.Rd. P, Lyons, NE spoke via zoom – in favor of wind for financial benefits for the County, he proposed sliding scale for fees based off of size
- 7) Sean Wazlaw, Project Development Manager for Con Edison, 101 W. Broadway, San Diego, CA spoke via zoom – in favor of wind energy; proposed setbacks based off of turbine size requesting the board be conservative in allowing larger turbines.
- 8) Josh Moening, Mayor of Norfolk, NE and Director of an energy group called New Power Nebraska, 1202 W. Norfolk Ave, Norfolk, NE spoke via zoom – in favor of wind/renewable energy; it creates local jobs and local revenue.
- 9) Serena Byrnes, resident of Burt County, NE spoke via zoom – opposed to large wind turbine projects; she feels Burt County residents will not benefit, it only benefits companies making money off of the projects.
- 10) Jennifer Dolezal, 1925 Co.Rd. 13, Lyons, NE spoke via zoom – opposed to industrial wind farms; good neighbor standards need to be applied to wind zoning.
- 11) Victor Jensen, 3030 Co.Rd. P, Tekamah, NE spoke via zoom – in favor of wind energy for tax relief and opposes the high permit fees for the projects, believes the use of natural resources (wind) can help property tax relief.
- 12) Jeff Kurtz representing Brad Bigelow Farms in Burt County, 5931 W. 88<sup>th</sup> Terrace, Overland Park, KS spoke via zoom – in favor of development of renewable energy in Burt County, asked to consider setbacks based on ice throw not a set distance.



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13) Bill Price, 1615 Co.Rd. 10, Lyons, NE spoke via zoom – not opposed to alternative energy, but is opposed to setbacks being proposed; setbacks should be based on turbine size and should be based from property lines not from residences.

14) Erin Raabe, 1855 Hwy 77, Lyons, NE spoke via zoom – opposed to wind turbines; concerned property values will be affected.

15) Laura Rieken, 2520 Co.Rd. LM, Craig, NE spoke via zoom – stated wind farm is being proposed on three sides of her property; she is opposed to wind turbines; asked the board to consider the county citizens not industry.

16) Center for Rural Affairs, Lyons, NE submitted written testimony – in favor of wind energy development/renewable energy projects. Shared CFRA.ORG information guide: Wind Energy Ordinances.

17) Sheryl Wingert, Tekamah, NE submitted written testimony in support of creating regulations that support the development of wind energy in Burt County, NE.

With no further public input, Chairman Schold closed the public hearing at 11:52 A.M. and the meeting went back into regular session.

Motion was made by Pearson to approve the updated zoning regulation changes noted in blue in the GLOSSARY (pg. 11-16) as recommended by the Burt County Planning Commission. The motion was seconded by Swanson, with roll call vote as follows: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays- none. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Morrow to approve the updated zoning regulation changes noted in blue for LIVESTOCK (pg. 61-68), language will include setbacks to be from “all residences”. Rodney Bromm, Chairman of Burt County Planning Commission explained that the set-backs proposals were taken from livestock friendly regulation recommendations and the set-backs are meant to be guidelines for minimums; operators will still apply for conditional use permits and during that process set-backs can be further modified if need. The motion was seconded by Pearson, with roll call vote as follows: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays- none. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Swanson to approve the updated zoning regulation changes noted in blue for AIRPORT ZONING (pg. 95-97) as recommended by the Burt County Planning Commission, with the following change: at ‘B.2.’ it will read ‘Zone Descriptions: The County will defer to the Airport Zoning Regulations and Zone Descriptions adopted by Tekamah Airport Joint Zoning Board on 12/14/2020’. The motion was seconded by Webster, with roll call vote as follows: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays- none. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Webster to approve the updated zoning regulation changes noted in blue for SOLAR (p. 125-132) as recommended by the Burt County Planning Commission, with the following conditions changed:

- 1) further clarification on permitted use (A.)
- 2) height changed to 15 feet for personal solar (B.3.)
- 3) height changed to 25 feet for solar farms (C.)



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- 4) setbacks changed for Solar Farms (C.2.A.): ‘a minimum of 83 feet from road; a minimum of 50 ft. from property line; a minimum of 300 feet from residence’
- 5) decommissioning (E.-N.) will be drafted to say ‘decommissioning plan, decommissioning bond plan and road plan will be addressed in the conditional use permit’

The motion was seconded by Richards, with roll call vote as follows: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays- none. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Morrow to approve updating zoning regulation changes for WIND (p. 87 - 87E.); changes will include:

- 1) add setbacks for wind turbines: ‘to be a minimum of 3.5 times the total turbine height from a residence’
- 2) add decommissioning language: ‘decommissioning plan, decommissioning bond plan and road plan will be addressed in the conditional use permit’

The motion was seconded by Swanson, with roll call vote as follows: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays- none. Motion carried.

The County Attorney will clean up grammar, punctuation, etc. and make the additional changes approved today in the Burt County Zoning Regulations (pgs. 11-132), and the County Board will ADOPT a Resolution for the final zoning regulation document changes/additions at a future meeting.

Motion was made by Pearson to **adopt the updated Burt County Zoning Permit Fee Schedule**, the motion was seconded by Webster, with roll call vote as follows: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays- none. Motion carried.
